### Presentation description:

Dr. Lin is the founder and lead of the public outreach initiative on climate change and energy transition – Impact Net Zero (<https://impactnetzero.ca/>). The goal is to educate and empower Canadians on our country's net zero journey. In this talk, Dr. Lin will outline actions that individual Canadians can take, as consumers and citizens, to help Canada reach its net zero goals.



**Bio:** Charles Lin is the founder and lead of Impact Net Zero (<https://impactnetzero.ca/>), an outreach initiative on climate change and energy transition aimed at the Canadian public. In 2019, Charles was a Fellow of the Advanced Leadership Initiative of Harvard University. From 1979 to 2017, he was a professor of weather and climate science at the University of Toronto and McGill University in Canada, and a senior manager in the Canadian federal government (ECCC;

Environment and Climate Change Canada) where he led ECCC's research in weather, climate and air quality science. Charles holds a B.Sc. in Physics and Mathematics from the University of British Columbia (UBC; 1974), and a Ph.D. in Meteorology from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT; 1979). He participated as member or lead of senior Canadian delegations to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) and the World Meteorological Organization (WMO), and published over 70 articles in refereed scientific journals in weather and climate science.
